The Embassy of the Republic of Korea presents its compliments to the Department of State of the United States of America and, with reference to the Agreement relating to Scientific and Technical Cooperation between the Government of the Republic of Korea and the Government of the United States of America, signed on 2 July 1999, and entered into force on 2 July 1999 for a five-year period, has the honor to propose on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Korea that, pursuant to Article XI, 2 thereof, the said Agreement be extended for an additional five years effective from 29 April 2004.

If the above proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United States of America, the Embassy proposes that this note and the Department's note in reply shall constitute an agreement between the two governments to extend the aforesaid Agreement for an additional five-year period, which shall enter into force on 2 July 2004.

The Embassy of the Republic of Korea avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Department of State of the United States of America the assurances of its highest consideration.
